Tips to Promote your Summer Meals Program

Make sure your community knows where to find locations!

The more students and families who know about your Summer Meals program, the better! Use every opportunity to tell them.

Thanks to our friends at **No Kid Hungry**, families can text the word FOOD to 304-304 to find nearby Summer Meals programs.

Calling the USDA Hotline at 1-866-348-6479 is another easy way to find free summer meals programs nearby.

- Hang posters in your cafeteria before school ends for summer.
- Talk to students in assembly about summer feeding locations, menus and planned activities.
- Engage teachers, school nurses, coaches and guidance counselors by recruiting them to spread awareness.
- Send home flyers and fact sheets to parents with final report cards or end-of-year communications.
- Give your program a catchy name and promote the foods to be served.
- Ask school administrators if you can include a reminder on the agenda of PTA meetings.
- Work with managers of recreation sites, community leaders or houses of worship to distribute flyers and spread the word.
- Write a press release for local media.
- Reach out to local newspapers, TV stations, blog writers and others. Your district communications office may be able to help.
- Hang posters in nearby laundromats, medical clinics, grocery stores, coffee shops, community pools, playgrounds, etc.
